As I posted on Facebook on 15 June 2023.
Presidential Records Act (44 US Code 2201 et seq) makes it clear:
•
Presidential records (defined in sec2201) belong to the U.S.
sec 2202: "The United States shall reserve and retain complete ownership, possession, and control of Presidential records; and such records shall be administered in accordance with the provisions of this chapter." That's by Public Law 95-591 sec2(a)(1978).
•
Section 2203 makes it clear the president may not even throw away a document unless it has little historical value AND he obtains permission of the Archivist. At noon on Jan 20, the documents belong to the Archives and the Presidents opportunity to remove his own stuff from them has passed.
